Rob Stein has been a science reporter and editor for more than 20 years. A graduate of the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, Stein began his science journalism career in 1987, when he became a health reporter for United Press International in Boston. After covering health and medicine for UPI for about five years, Stein became UPI's Science Editor, overseeing the news agency's world science coverage. After completing a journalism fellowship at the Harvard School of Public Health, Stein moved to National Public Radio as a science editor at the radio network. After about five years at NPR, Stein took over as the Science Editor at The Washington Post, a position he held for about six years. Since 2002, Stein has been covering health and medical issues at the Post.
