



## **Paul M. Coates, Ph.D.**

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Paul M. Coates, Ph.D., is the director of the Office of Dietary Supplements (ODS) at the National Institutes of Health (NIH). He directs an office whose purpose and responsibilities were defined in the Dietary Supplement Health and Education Act (DSHEA) of 1994. Prior to joining the ODS, Dr. Coates served as deputy director of the Division of Nutrition Research Coordination (DNRC) at the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases (NIDDK). In that role, Dr. Coates helped to coordinate human nutrition research efforts, both at the NIH and between the NIH and other government agencies. He was cochair of the joint DHHS/USDA Steering Committee overseeing plans for the National Nutrition Summit that was held in Washington in May 2000. Prior to joining the DNRC, Dr. Coates was NIDDK's program director for the Type 2 Diabetes Research Program and project officer for the multicenter clinical study called Epidemiology of Diabetes Interventions and Complications. He maintained an active role in career development and fellowship training in the Division of Diabetes, Endocrinology, and Metabolic Diseases until his departure from NIDDK. He received his Ph.D. in human genetics from Queen's University in Canada and performed his postdoctoral training in the Department of Human Genetics and Biometry at University College London.
